Reigniting the flame of India-South Korea defence cooperation

- 1. **Geopolitical Dynamics**: Evolving coalitions involving North Korea, China, and Russia introduce new challenges, necessitating a deeper understanding of each country's strategic needs and alignments.
- 2. **Technology Collaboration**: Joint development of advanced defense systems, especially in areas like space and cybersecurity, demonstrates the technological prowess of both nations.
- 3. **Maritime Security**: Potential collaboration exists in maritime security through joint patrolling and information sharing, given the significant maritime interests of both countries.
- 4. **Counter Terrorism**: India and South Korea share concerns about terrorism, suggesting potential collaborative strategies to bolster defense and security.
- 5. **United Nations Peacekeeping**: Both countries have experience in UN peacekeeping, indicating opportunities to share insights and resources for global stability.
- 6. **Joint Military Exercises**: The recent high-level visit signifies opportunities for enhanced joint exercises and interoperability.

The Way Forward: A strategic approach based on shared visions, technological partnerships, and adapting to evolving global dynamics is crucial for a robust and enduring defense relationship between India and South Korea.
