The impact of structured negotiation in India manifests in various ways:

- 1. **Mitigation of Legal Delays:** It addresses the backlog in Indian courts by offering a more efficient dispute resolution process.
- 2. **Support for National Disability Law:** It aids in enforcing the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, using authorities like the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities to oversee compliance.

However, its efficacy can be varied, as shown in instances like the PayTM incident. Efforts to enhance app accessibility for disabled users inadvertently led to decreased accessibility. This underscores the significance of consistent and quality execution to genuinely benefit disabled individuals.
